Expertise of the Team Leader and Department

Dr [Aet Annist](#) is a social anthropologist with considerable experience with devising, and implementing **qualitative empirical research** in particular on the **emerging socio-economic and spatial inequalities and deriving new concepts and theories** based on such evidence. Her particular contributions include developing theories on symbolic, social and ethnic dispossessions and emergence of new class relations in changing economies.

Annist has actively contributed to **bridging disciplinary divides as well as crossing sectors** in Estonia with her publications. She has participated in several collaborative research proposals focusing on **transdisciplinary cooperation** (SSH cooperation with STEM disciplines) **as well as cooperation between science, arts and society** (empowering citizens through art triggered actions). She has put forward the initial plans for a **Climate Research Centre** within University of Tartu (to be finalised in the first half of 2021), **led by SSH disciplines** but working in close collaboration with STEM disciplines, aspiring towards a new, STEAMS approach.

Annist has contributed to **strategy analyses** of various Estonian ministries and boards. She has trained as a **community and conflict facilitator**, and her outreach work includes supporting **conflict facilitation** cases. Her experiences in intervention development include preparing for a local **People's Assembly** in the UK, and participating at and analysing **community forums** in Estonia. She is regularly communicating social sciences research to the media and is involved in **co-creation practices** with Estonian **artists** and **museologists** and UK and Estonian **environmental protest groups**. Her most recent [publications](#) are analysing the **processes that restrict recognition of diversity of interests**.

Dr Annist is affiliated with the **Institute of Cultural Research and Arts** which focuses on researching various aspects of culture and society, and is working within **the Department of Ethnology and UNESCO Chair on Applied Studies of Intangible Cultural Heritage**. The Department of Ethnology carries out diverse research on contemporary transcultural processes on global, regional and local levels, and UNESCO Chair focuses on conceptualizations of heritage processes and identity construction.

Annist was one of the researchers who were featured in the Net4Society e-Magazine [ISSUES January 2021 edition](#).
